The genus Microrchestia (Amphipoda: Talitridae) in eastern Australia

Abstract

Microrchestia is reported from Australia for the first time and two new species are described, M. bousfieldi sp. nov. from northern New South Wales and M. watsonae sp. nov. from the northern Great Barrier Reef. The new genus Cochinorchestia is established for Microrchestia notabilis (K.H. Barnard), originally described from the Cochin area in south-eastern India.

Introduction

Bousfield (1984) established the genus *Microrchestia* for *Parorchestia macrochela* Bousfield, 1971, known from New Britain in the Bismarck Archipelago, Papua New Guinea. He indicated additional species in the genus from Ecuador, Nigeria, Madagascar and south-eastern India. In table 5 he transferred *Parorchestia notabilis* K.H. Barnard, 1935, from south-eastern India and *Parorchestia similis* Bousfield, 1971, from New Britain to *Microrchestia*. As far as we know the other taxa referred to in table 5 have never been described. In this paper we describe a new genus, *Cochinorchestia* for *P. notabilis* K.H. Barnard, 1935, redefine the genus *Microrchestia*, and describe two new species of *Microrchestia* (*M. bousfieldi* and *M. watsonae*) from eastern Australia.

Material and methods

The descriptions were generated from a DELTA database (Dallwitz 2005) to the talitrid genera and species of the world. All material is lodged in the Australian Museum, Sydney (AM). Abbreviations are: A, antenna; G, gnathopod; gi, gill; UL, upper lip; MD, mandible; LL, lower lip; MX, maxilla; MXP, maxilliped; oo, oostegite; P, pereopod; pl, pleopod; T, telson; U, uropod; f, female; m, male; L, left; R, right.

Talitridae Raphinesque, 1815

Cochinorchestia gen. nov.

Microrchestia Bousfield, 1984: 202 (in part).

Type species. Parorchestia notabilis K.H. Barnard, 1935.

Etymology. The generic name uses the geographic name Cochin from the local area and the stem Orchestia.
